HONOUR BOX: *Dr José Daniel Menezes*



Dr José Daniel Menezes

José Daniel Menezes passed away on June 25th, 2023, at the age of 69 at his house in Lisbon with Maria João his beloved wife by his side.

Despite a paralyzing reaction to the sad news, we felt it was imperative to write some words not only for family and friends, but also for trainees and colleagues that José Daniel has always helped with extreme patience and happiness.

Following graduation in Medicine from the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Lisbon in 1977 and completion of a general compulsory internship, he chose the Santa Marta Hospital with the aim of doing the postgraduate surgical training in Vascular Surgery.

It was back in 1988, when Dr. Daniel Menezes had the recognition of his specialty certification in Vascular Surgery, by the Portuguese Medical Association, with honors.

Over the course of his career Dr. Daniel Menezes has received many distinctions, awards and recognition of his clinical activity with invitations to lead Units and Departments of Angiology and Vascular Surgery in different public and private hospitals: São Francisco Xavier, São José, CUF Descobertas, CUF Belém and CUF Torres Vedras. It should be highlighted his challenging position

as the first Director of the Department of Angiology and Vascular Surgery in the Garcia de Orta Hospital, in Almada, and the Clinical Director of the Saint Louis Hospital, in Lisbon.

Among its multiple scientific assignments it should be highlighted being Founding member, first Treasurer, Secretary General and President of the Portuguese Society for Angiology and Vascular Surgery. During his different mandates he was the National Coordinator of the Registry of Abdominal Aortic Aneurysms and the National Registry of Vascular Interventions.

Dr. Daniel Menezes was strongly committed with Phlebology, particularly in the field of venous ulcers, having a huge amount of work and close relationship with phlebological and wound scientific societies, at a national and international level. He had a continuous participation in the activities of the UIP (International Union of Phlebology) and EVF (European Venous Forum).

During many years he was invited examiner of the UEMS Section and Board of Vascular Surgery to run the European exams conferring the title of FEBVS (Fellow of the European Board of Vascular Surgery).

Dr. Daniel Menezes was also the national representative of Portugal during 3 years in the council of the ESVS (European Society for Vascular Surgery).

To recognize his lifetime achievement and contributions in vascular medicine and surgery, in particular in wound care, the ELCOS Association has established the National Prize of Good Practices in Health Care Dr. José Daniel Menezes since 2019.

More than a high-qualified vascular surgeon and clinician, he was a great friend of all of us, recognized as a wonderful person. We will miss him but even more important we will remember him.

17th Romanian Congress of Phlebology Annual Meeting

Between the 18th and 20th of May 2023, the 17th Romanian Congress of Phlebology with international participation took place in Timișoara, Romania. The scientific event was organized by the Romanian Society of Phlebology under the auspices of the International Union of Phlebology, International Union of Angiology, v-WIN Foundation, and the University of Medicine and Pharmacy Victor Babeș Timișoara. The scientific caliber was exceptional, as the congress featured esteemed speakers with extensive expertise in phlebology, such as Sergio Giancesini, Pier Luigi Antignani, Zaza Lazarshvili, and Lorenzo Tessari.

The Latin American group present at the congress organized an excellent symposium led by Oscar Botini (Argentina) and Sorin Olariu (Romania), with the participation of moderators Chantal Aguero (Paraguay), Lorena Grillo (Costa Rica), and panelists Luis Arias (Bolivia), Mariuxi Morales (Ecuador), Paola Ortiz (Uruguay), Julianne Stoughton (USA), and Nathalia Cardoso (Brazil). During the event, Oscar Botini took the opportunity to present the highly successful project - Venous Mapping - emphasizing its significance and practicality. During this occasion, Oscar Botini presented the successfully accomplished project - Venous Mapping - unveiling its remarkable achievements and underscoring its importance and utility through profound scientific considerations. Additionally, the launch of the upcoming project targeting the deep venous system was announced. The group from the Republic of Moldova presented interesting scientific works on tactical and strategic aspects in the management of chronic venous disease, considerations on deep vein thrombosis, and portal vein reconstruction in the treatment of pancreatic cancer.

A special and interesting approach to venous malformations and the treatment of venous ulcers was presented by the German group coordinated by Thomas Noppeney from Nürnberg.

The poster session took place on the last day of the congress and included young authors, students from the

University of Medicine and Pharmacy Victor Babeș Timișoara.

Of particular notice, the engagement of the young generation who took active during the scientific work and the related heated debates.

The social program included visits to the city of Timișoara, the European Capital of Culture for the year, with the presentation of historical and cultural objectives conducted by a specialized guide. Additionally, two collegial evenings were organized in a unique atmosphere.

Considering that the V-Italy meeting was scheduled in Albarella, Italy, between the 25th and 28th of May, in order to unite the two events, a Timișoara-Albarella excursion was organized, facilitating the travel of those who wanted to participate in both scientific events. The European capitals of Budapest and Zagreb, as well as the wonderful cities of Trieste, Venice, and Verona, were visited during this excursion. In conclusion, the event offered the chance to highlight the high level of Romania Phlebology practice, while learning from and exchanging expertise with top international experts, confirming the didactic potentials of European region.

V-ITALy 2023

Post Event Report

Last May 25-28, in Albarella Island (ITALY), venous-lymphatic World International Network (v-WIN) foundation hosted the **V-ITALy** 11th International Interuniversity meeting in Phlebology, Lymphology & Aesthetics. More than a global congress, the event represented a “VITAL” part of the educational, editorial and hybrid world project, gathering together all continents to identify “VITAL” literature we all should know and “VITAL” research lines we should develop.

250 in person top experts joined from 39 countries of all continents. 6348 online single attendees joined from 92 countries in a dedicated digital platform that was accessed to enjoy also extra educational content by **24.321** people. The virtual bag, including educational and promotional material, also of different scientific societies from all around the world, reported 9.113 downloads.

These numbers speak for a **new vital educational era**, combining digital and in person opportunities. Of particular notice, the attention toward the **new generation** who enjoyed the maximum allowed time on stage, even more than the same KOLs. Tutored by the latter, the new generation representatives provided an insight of what was uploaded in the digital pre-congress library, while **all the world has been invited to contribute** by submitting video presentations on what is considered VITAL for proper vein-lymphatic care advancement.

Worth of notice also the engagement of **Ministry** and **institutions** representatives from different nations, as follow up of the previous action v-WIN delivered during the World Expo 2022.

V-ITALy was honored in hosting a **UIP session** that included a multi-specialty call to synergy and a special scientific lecture of prof. Lee in honor of prof. Partsch. Moreover, a special insight on the future of Phlebology was provided by the UIP president Parsi and Executive Director Connor.

Of great importance the engagement of **different specialties** representatives, such as Cardiology, Orthopaedics, Rehab, OBGyn and General Medicine, together with **patients associations**, in the dedicated Science Per Aquam project. A **historic honorary lecture by Gordon Guyatt**, head of the GRADE Group, pointed out the fragility of different phlebo-lymphology guidelines and the importance of proper scientific advancement.

The **population** of Albarella Island was also engaged (more than 3.000 inhabitants) in a dedicated public vein-lymphatic awareness moment. Pre-congress sport initiatives were included to promote teambuilding and public health awareness.

A beautiful social gathering was dedicated to Indonesia Venous Forum, in honor of the upcoming joint **v-WIN Indonesia meeting** (October 2024). Until then, everyone is invited to **enjoy the open access re-broadcasting of the event**

Histopathological analysis of vascular malformations

Objective

To propose and develop a histopathological criteria to help diagnose vascular malformations.

Methods

All patients who underwent surgical resection and had a confirmed histopathological diagnosis of vascular malformations from 01 March 2018-26 February 2020 were included. A criteria based on 10 parameters was developed to help diagnose vascular malformations. Discrepancies between clinical and histopathological diagnosis were evaluated.

Results

A total of 18 cases were identified. There was a discrepancy between the clinical diagnosis and the initially reported histopathological diagnosis in 16 cases (88.9%). This was reduced to 7 (38.9%) and 6 cases (33.3%) with first and second time revised histopathological analysis using proposed criteria.

Conclusions

The discrepancy between clinical and histopathological diagnoses of vascular malformations has highlighted the requirement of an agreed criteria for histopathologists to help formulate their diagnosis. The proposed criteria may be used as a guide in addressing this and guide treatment and improve clinical practice.

Effect of dysmorphic plantar arch on venous hemodynamics of the lower limb

Background

The role of the plantar venous pump (PVP) on venous return is evident but the effects of the foot morphology have never been characterized properly.

Method

52 healthy volunteers—26 with normal plantar arch (control) and 26 with dysmorphic plantar arch (in two subgroups: 13 flat feet, 13 hollow feet)—were included. Using Doppler ultrasound, we measured the diameter and the peak systolic velocity in the large veins of the lower limb after PVP stimulation by manual compression and bodyweight transfer.

Result

The mean peak systolic velocity of the studied veins varied from 12.2 cm/s to 41.7 cm/s in the control group and from 10.9 cm/s to 39.1 cm/s in the dysmorphic plantar group. The foot arch morphology did not affect significantly the venous blood flows, except in the great saphenous vein during manual compression.

Conclusion

The plantar morphology did not induce a significant increase of venous blood velocity resulting from PVP stimulation.

Leg volume reduction during tiptoe movement is caused by venous ejection and calf muscle contraction

Objectives

To clarify the cause of leg volume reduction during tiptoe movement in the standing position.

Methods

The right legs of 20 participants were assessed. The participants performed tiptoe movement in the supine position, and then stood up and performed the tiptoe movement and ankle dorsiflexion. Leg volume changes were recorded continuously using air plethysmography.

Results

Differences between leg volume changes due to tiptoe movement and the refilling volumes were not significantly different between the supine (59 mL) and standing (49 mL) positions, indicating that this amount of motion artifact was included in the downward trace recorded by tiptoe movement in the standing position.

Conclusions

Leg volume reduction during tiptoe movement in the standing position included a significant amount of motion artifacts. Therefore, it may be difficult to accurately measure the ejection volume using tiptoe movement in the standing position.

Efficacy and safety of vena cava filters in preventing pulmonary embolism: A systematic review and meta-analysis

Objectives

To assess the treatment effectiveness of inferior vena cava filters (IVCF) versus non-IVCF for patients undergoing varies conditions.

Methods

We systematically searched the databases to identify eligible RCTs from their inception up to 9/20/2020. The primary endpoint was pulmonary embolism (PE), while the secondary endpoints included deep-vein thrombosis (DVT), major bleeding, and all-cause mortality. The RRs with 95% CIs were applied as effect estimates for the treatment effectiveness of IVCF versus non-IVCF and calculated by using the random-effects model.

Results

1,137 patients of 5 RCTs were enrolled. There were no significant differences between IVCF and non-IVCF for the risk of PE, major bleeding, and all-cause mortality, while the risk of DVT was significantly increased for patients treated with IVCF.

Conclusions

The use of IVCF did not yield any benefits on PE, major bleeding, and all-cause mortality risk for patients undergoing various conditions, while the risk of DVT was significantly increased for patients treated with IVCF.

Pregnancy outcomes in 16 women with previous catheter-directed thrombolysis and stenting for acute left iliofemoral deep vein thrombosis

Background

Whether iliac vein stents affect pregnancy or whether they will be affected by pregnancy was rarely reported in the literature. The aim of this study was to report our experience of pregnancy in women who received thrombolysis and stenting for a previous deep vein thrombosis (DVT).

Methods

16 patients with previous stenting for treatment of acute left iliofemoral DVT who had subsequent pregnancies were identified. Patient demographic information and outcomes were recorded. Duplex scanning and venography were performed as scheduled to evaluate the patency of stents in perinatal period and at 12 months after delivery.

Results

None of the patients had a hemorrhagic complication and recurrent venous thromboembolism during their pregnancies and postpartum. No stent compression/occlusion and structural damage occurrence in all patients during follow-up.

Conclusion

Pregnancy managed with prophylactic dalteparin resulted in no re-thrombotic events or structural damage to the iliac stents and did not appear to negatively affect pregnancy outcomes.

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


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UIP WORLD CONGRESS 2025
