LYMPHOLOGY FACTS ALL VEIN-EXPERTS SHOULD KNOW

It is a fact that the human lymphatic system has been neglected by the medical community all over the world. Lymphedema, one of the most known lymphatic diseases, can be an important problem for the patient as well as for the health system because it is a chronic situation.

The blood of the human body passes through the arterial system, venous system and the Lymphatic system.

Lymphedema is an abnormal accumulation of rich protein fluid in the interstitium which causes chronic inflammation and reactive fibrosis of the affected tissues.

We must know that 90% of the blood return through the vein system and 10% of the blood return through the lymphatic system and the very important functions of the Lymphatic System are:

- Return of proteins to the cardiovascular system
- Remove excess fluid from interstitium
- Intestinal lymph vessels transport fat (chyle)
- All the Immunological functions of our body

Oedema is a symptom BUT Lymphedema is a Medical disease!!!

Lymphedema: A big problem! When an oedema is Lymphedema?

Three Questions we must answer before we take the decision for the management of Lymphedema

STEPS FOR THE DIAGNOSIS OF LYMPHEDEMA

1. IS THIS LYMPHEDEMA?

We must discuss with our patients in order we get the correct information.

- patient medical history
- clinical examination of the patient and
- diagnostic investigations.

Differential Diagnosis of Lymphoedema

In the clinical examination we must remember and to examine very important clinical signs and the most important is the Stemmer's sign. Positive Stemmer's sign is usually sufficient (combined with other clinical characteristics of lymphoedema) to make the diagnosis of lymphoedema without further diagnostic examinations. Stemmer's sign is positive when a thickened cutaneous fold at the dorsum of the toes or fingers cannot be lifted or is difficult to lift. A positive Stemmer's sign is considered as a proof of lymphostatic oedema of the extremity.

Concerning the diagnostic investigations the most important imaging methods are:

Lymphoangioscintigraphy: gold standard examination for the lymphatic system which is a dynamic process of the lymph in the superficial and deep lymphatic areas of the extremities.

Magnetic resonance (MR) lymphography: non-invasive method, giving many data on the lymphatic status of both the superficial and deep lymphatic areas of extremities. This imaging tool will represent the gold standard examination in the future.

HONOUR BOX

LYMPHOLOGY FACTS ALL VEIN-EXPERTS SHOULD KNOW

Differential Diagnosis of Lymphoedema

When we have the suspicion of Lymphedema we MUST exclude always two situations

- Deep vein thrombosis *and*
- New Malignancy

Lipoedema is not Lymphedema: Lipoedema occurs mainly in women, with bilateral, symmetrical swelling from iliac crest to ankles and is usually painful. The dorsum of feet is never involved, and the Stemmer's sign is negative.

2.PRIMARY OR SECONDARY LYMPHEDEMA?

A. One of the new tools to check up the primary Lymphedema is the genetic testing.

B. Very important risk factors for secondary lymphedema

- Extensive surgery
- Radiation therapy
- Specific systemic therapies especially taxane-based regimens
- Body mass index / Morbid obesity
- Inactivity
- Injuries to derivative lymphatic pathways

3. WHAT STAGE OF LYMPHEDEMA ?

Stage 0: Latency Stage

(No visible/palpable edema) Subjective complaints: heaviness, achiness, and discomfort of the affected extremity

Stage1: Reversible Lymphedema

(Accumulation of protein-rich edema fluid -Pitting edema -Reduces with elevation of extremity)

Stage 2: Irreversible Lymphedema

Pitting becomes progressively more difficult
Connective tissue proliferation (fibrosis) Oedema reduced with difficulty (by elevation of the affected extremity)

Stage 3: Lymphostatic Elephantiasis

(Non pitting-Fibrosis and sclerosis: severe induration- Skin changes: papillomas, hyperkeratosis etc)

MANAGEMENT OF LYMPHEDEMA

WE have Conservative treatment, Surgical treatment, the Combination of them and Prevention.

1. Conservative treatment

Combined Physical Therapy (CPT/CDT) is the gold standard for the conservative management of lymphedema.

CPT/CDT) is a 5 part program consisting of:

- 1) Manual Lymphatic Drainage;
- 2) Gradient compression bandaging;
- 3) Therapeutic exercises;
- 4) Skin care,
- 5) training of patient-self care

The goal is a 70%.....100% reduction of lymphedema volume.

Many studies have isolated parts of CDT and demonstrated their effectiveness: To reduce edema only:20-30 %!!!!

PREREQUISITES of successful combined therapy (CDT) are

- the availability of physicians (i.e. clinical lymphologists), nurses, and therapists specifically trained, educated experienced in this method,
- acceptance of health insurers to underwrite the cost of treatment, and a biomaterials industry willing to provide high-quality products.
- the compliance of patients during and after the treatment

2. Surgical Treatment

Different surgical techniques and schools!

Proximal multiple LVA technique creates multiple lymphatic-venous anastomoses (LVA)

Primary Prevention: meaning to minimize injury of the lymphatic system by cancer treatment is now possible only with reverse mapping and LYMPHA technique.

Debulking techniques include minimally invasive approaches, such as liposuction, that is performed to remove accumulated fat and fibrotic tissue.

The understanding of the indications for vascularized lymph node transfer (VLNT) and its mechanism of action are still evolving. Major concerns relating to VLNT include donor site morbidity and patient selection.

Lymphedema surgical treatment must be performed only in highly experienced centers and always with combination of complete decongestive therapy

3. PREVENTION IS THE BEST TREATMENT TO AVOID LYMPHEDEMA

We should inform patients of early signs and symptoms of aching, feelings of heaviness, tightness, fullness or stiffness that often precede visible swelling.

Clinicians should educate patients on critical risk reducing strategies that are practical and evidence based (do's and don'ts)

We must give to them the correct instructions and information.

ATTENTION

Lymphologists must know all the therapies of lymphedema, their complications and their indications and contraindications.

Lymphologist is responsible for all the treatment (scientifically and legally)

Same protocols on education and on training for the treatment of Lymphedema

The earliest we start the treatment the best results we have.




